Heinz Lehmann Award

Dr. Michael Meaney is the recipient of the 2005 Canadian College of Neuropsychopharmacology (CCNP) Heinz Lehmann Award. Dr. Meaney is currently a Full Professor in the Departments of Psychiatry and Neurology at McGill University in Montréal, Que., and is Director of the McGill Program for the Study of Behaviour, Genes and Environment. This award is designed to recognize outstanding research achievements by Canadian scientists in the field of neuropsychopharmacology. The award, donated by Eli Lilly Canada Inc., consists of a \$5000 research prize, a \$2000 travel award for the recipient to attend the CCNP Annual Meeting and an engraved plaque. Young Investigator Award

Dr. Jeffrey Meyer is the recipient of the 2005 Canadian College of Neuropsychopharmacology (CCNP) Young Investigator Award. A special plenary symposium will address "Current issues in psychopharmacology: a CINP executive perspective." The panel comprises Herbert Meltzer (Vanderbilt University), Brian Leonard (National University of Ireland) and Torgny Svensson (Karolinska Institutet, Sweden).

Award lectures will be delivered by the winners listed above.

Symposia topics will include:

- Immune mechanisms in psychiatric and neurodegenerative diseases
- Novel pharmacological approaches to dementia treatment
- Cholesterol, lipid metabolism and mental health
- The amygdala and bed nucleus of stria terminalis: motivation and emotion
- Psychopharmacological treatment of aggression and self-injury
- Molecular mechanisms of behavioural change
- Imaging studies of the serotonergic system in affective disorders

Posters will be available for the duration of the meeting; there will be specified session times for short oral presentations.
